named being duly affirmed did declare & affirm that the within writing  
contains the true last will & testament of Nicholas Albertson. He testifies them names as far  
as he knows & as he truly believes and that he will well & truly perform the same by first  
paying the debts of the said dec. and then the legacies in the said testament specified in favor  
the good charity & bequests of the said dec. can thereunto extend and that he will make & exhibit  
into the surrogate office of the said court a true & correct inventory of all & every one of the good charity & bequests of the  
said dec. that have or shall come to his knowledge & possession or to the possession of any other person  
known for him or under a true account when thereunto lawfully required Nicholas Albertson

Affirmed at New York the 31<sup>st</sup> day of August

In The Name of God amen I Nicholas of the Township of Knowlton County of Lyber & State of New Jersey being of sound mind & memory do Make This my last will & Testament first I defer almighty God To receive my soul who gave it me & my Body to The Earth from whence it came to be decently by my Executors here after mentioned as for my Lonly Estate I defer that my Dear Wife Sarah and her ant Cathreen Enley be supported and maintained by my son Henry During Their lives and the surviving children of my decessed Daughter angliche to be paid one hundred dollars each as they arrive of full age by my Executors Nicholas Albertson son of Janet. and I give my son Dineck The two lots of land where on he now liveth he first paying to my Daughter edick the present wife of Peter Engle one thousand dollars in four equal payments that is to say two hundred & fifty dollars in one yeare after my deeth and so on yearly untill The one thousand dollars be fully paid and I give to my son Henry my humstid Plantation he first paying to my Daughter Cathrena one thousand dollars in four equal yearly payments the first to be paid in one yeare as above &c and I give to my Daughter Elizabeth one thousand dollars to be paid as above by my Executors &c and I give to my son Elam one dollar now as the remainder of thirteen and ~~and~~ hundred dollars which I have paid him already at his request &c But should any of my children be deaving no living ife there shane to be Equly divided amongst my surviving children &c now should any dispute arise among my children I defer that they go not to Law But leave all to Three indifrent men - one to be chosen by my Executors & one by each ~~Equly divided among my children shane & share alike &c~~ and The remainder of my Estate if any to be Equly divided among my children shane & share alike &c
