Enclosed herewith

Nicholas Albertson the executor the within testament  
named being duly examined, did declare & affirm that the within writing  
contains the true last will & testament of Nicholas Albertson. He testifies that he knows  
as he knows & as he truly believes and that he will well & truly perform the same by first  
paying the debts of the said dec. and then the legacies in the said testament specified in force  
the goods chattels & credits of the said dec. can thereunto extend and that he will make & exhibit  
into the benifits office of the said dec. a true & correct inventory of all & every one of the goods chattels & credits of the  
said dec. that he can come to his knowledge & possession into the possession of any other person  
known for her use & render a true account when thereunto lawfully required

In the Name of God Amen - I Nicholas of the Township of Knowlton County of Sussex State of  
New Jersey being of sound mind & memory do make this my last will & testament first I defer abnighly  
God to receive my Soul who gave it me & my Body to the Earth from whence it came to be decently  
by my Executors here after mentioned as for my ~~dearly~~ Estate I desire that my Dear Wife Marie  
and her ant Cathreen Esley be supported and maintained by my Son Henry during their Lives  
and the surviving Children of my Deceased Daughter Angliche to be paid one hundred Dollars each as  
they come of full age by my Executors Nicholas Albertson son of Garnet and I give my Son Dick the two lots  
of Land where on he now liveth he first paying to my Daughter which the present wife of Peter Engle  
one thousand Dollars in four equal payments that is to say two hundred & fifty Dollars in one yeare  
after my death and so on yearly untill the one thousand Dollars be fully paid - and I give to my Son  
Henry my hurrellid Plantation he first paying to my Daughter Cathrena one thousand Dollars in four  
equal yearly payments the first to be paid in one yeare as above &c and I give to my Daughter  
Elizabeth one thousand Dollars to be paid as above by my Executors &c and I give to my Son  
Eliam one Dollar now as the remainder of thirteen ~~and one~~ hundred Dollars which I have paid him already  
at his request &c But should any of my Children die leaving no living issue their share to be Equly divided  
amongst my surviving Children &c - now should any dispute arise among my Children I desire that  
they go not to Law But leave all to three indifferent men - one to be chosen by my Executors & one by each  
Equly divided among my Children share & share alike &c ~~and the remainder of my Estate if any to be~~  
Witness my hand & Seal the tenth Day of ~~June~~ & in the yeare of our Lord Eighteen hundred

amongst My surviving children I desire that they go not to Law but leave all to three indifferent men - one to be chosen by My Executors & one by each of My Children & the third to be chosen by the said three men & the residue of My estate if any to be equally divided among My Children share & share alike &
